Iowa County ADRC Board

Do you have an interest in serving Iowa County? The ADRC Board represents adults 60 and older and adults with a disability. If you are interested, contact the local office to get a description of the board member requirements. Mileage reimbursement is offered to those traveling outside of Dodgeville.

Aging and Disability Resource Center Specialists

Aging and Disability Resource Center Specialists provide up-to-date information on many services and resources, including, but not limited to: Home Health Agencies, Transportation Services, Public Benefits, Housing Options, Personal Care Agencies, Senior Dining Sites, Home Delivered Meal Programs, Support Groups, Prevention Classes, Managed Care, Self-Directed Support Waivers and much, much more!

- Options counseling is a one-on-one consultation to help you think through the
 pros and cons of the various options in light of your situation, values, resources
 and preferences. Information is provided by an ADRC Specialist about the
 choices you have. For example, when making decisions about where to live,
 what kind of help you need, where to receive that care and help, and how to pay
 for it.
- Youth Transition- If you are a young adult with a disability transitioning from the school system and/or children's programs to adult programs, the Aging & Disability Resource Center is here to help you and your families make that transition as smooth as possible. Many changes in disability services occur when a student is between the age of 18 and 21. ADRC Specialists at the Aging & Disability Resource Center can assist in answering questions you may have. A Youth in Transition guide is available at no cost.
- Long Term Care Services: The ADRC is responsible for helping people access
 publicly funded long term care programs and assisting them in understanding all
 available options. ADRC staff determines functional eligibility and help facilitate
 financial eligibility with Economic Support. If eligible, ADRC staff help facilitate
 enrollment.
- **Nursing Home Relocation:** Nursing home relocation may be an option for someone who is a resident of a nursing home that wishes to relocate to either independent living in the community or to assisted living. You may be eligible if:
 - You are 65 years of age or older OR 18 years of age or older and have a disability
 - The nursing home is currently billing Wisconsin Medicaid for your stay/services
 - Your stay in the nursing home has been long-term or is expected to be long-term
- Caregiver Support: Provides a wide variety of resources and information to adults and their families in the community through a variety of programs and services, including caregiver support groups.

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Dementia Care Specialist

The Dementia Care Specialist (DCS) plays a variety of roles in supporting individuals impacted by dementia and promoting community awareness of the conditions. The DCS supports individuals with dementia, their families, and loved ones through consultation to discuss such things as programs, resources, supports, caregiving techniques, and planning. Community awareness is also promoted by the DCS through dementia-friendly community initiatives, educational events, and social media.

Benefit Specialists

Elder Benefit Specialist:

Specializes in assisting persons age 60 and older to attain access to needed benefits and programs.

Disability Benefit Specialist:

Specializes in assisting persons aged 18 years-59 to attain access to needed benefits and programs.

Benefit Specialists can help in accessing both private and public programs and benefits, and can provide information about consumer rights. They can provide information and advocacy on a wide range of issues and assist with the application and/or appeal process for public and private benefits like Medicare, Social Security, Medicaid, Disability, SeniorCare, Supplemental Security Income and Medigap Insurance. Many of the benefit issues that people over the age of 60 and adults with disabilities face are very complex. Benefit Specialists assess the situation and discuss options so that persons can make an informed decision.

Health & Wellness Workshops

Living Well with Chronic Conditions- This six week workshop is for people who have one or more chronic conditions. A chronic condition is an ongoing health problem or disease such as diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, depression, and other long-term problems. Mutual support and success build participants' confidence in their ability to manage their health condition to maintain active and fulfilling lives. Participants of this program have reported from improved general health, fewer days of hospitalizations, and fewer health care visits.

Healthy Living with Diabetes-This program is intended for anyone who has, or lives with someone who has, diabetes. This is a six week workshop designed to be a complement to treatment that participants receive from their health providers. Classes are highly participative, where mutual support and success build participants' confidence in their ability to manage their health condition and maintain active and fulfilling lives.

Stepping-On-This seven week evidenced-based program is proven to reduce falls and build confidence in older people. This program is a small-group workshop that is specifically designed for people who are at risk of falling, have a fear of falling, or who have fallen one or more times. Classes are taught by trained leaders and include guest experts who address a variety of issues including proper shoe fitting, medication management, vision, and strengthening exercises.

Tai Chi- This is a twelve week workshop that meets twice a week. It is offered through the ADRC and Public Health Department. Tai Chi is a graceful form of exercise that involves a series of movements, known as forms, that are performed in a slow, focused manner combined with controlled breathing. It is a low impact exercise that puts minimal stress on muscles and joints making it suitable for many older adults.

Healthy Living with Chronic Pain is for people who have on-going, persistent pain. Developed at Stanford University, the workshop sessions meet for 2-1/2 hours, once a week, for six consecutive weeks. This community-based program is very interactive, where mutual support and success build participants' confidence in their ability to manage their pain and maintain active and fulfilling lives. Facilitated by two trained Leaders in a small group setting, the program delves into various topics related to mental, physical, and emotional well-being. Gain knowledge, share your experience, practice new skills, and help others while helping yourself.

Mind Over Matter is designed to give women the tools they need to take control of bladder and bowel leakage. Join a MOM workshop for 3 sessions, each lasting 2 hours, every other week for one month and learn strategies for preventing or lessening symptoms including information-sharing, group activities, simple exercises, and dietary changes. With practice, these new skills are proven to help you avoid or reduce leakage so you can keep doing the things that matter most to you. Researched and proven to improve bladder symptoms for 71% of participants and bowel symptoms for 55%!

Powerful Tools for Caregivers is a six week (once a week) educational workshop for people who are taking care of a family member or friend designed to support the family caregiver and improve their well-being. It does not teach hands-on care or focus on disease or other conditions, but rather helps the caregiver cope with the physical, emotional and financial challenges of being a caregiver.

Walk with Ease- Learn how to safely make physical activity part of your everyday life. This workshop is designed to help people living with arthritis better manage their pain but it is also ideal for people without arthritis who want to make walking a regular habit.

These programs are sponsored by the Aging & Disability Resource Center with the support of Upland Hills Health, Iowa County Health Department or another sponsor. Stepping-On is offered for a \$5 fee; all other workshops are offered at no cost. To register, please call the Aging & Disability Resource Center at 608-930-9835.

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IN-HOME SERVICES

There are a variety of services and programs that can be brought into the home to assist in keeping people safe and helping them to be more independent. Listed below are some of the more common services used. Other service and program information can be obtained from the Aging and Disability Resource Center.

Emergency Medical Alert Systems

When emergency help is needed, the user can press the transmitter's "help" button, sending a radio signal to the console. This causes the console to automatically dial one or more preselected emergency telephone numbers. The transmitter can be worn around the wrist, neck, or attached to a belt loop. In addition to the list below, some retail businesses sell similar response systems as well. Contact the ADRC for a complete list at 608-930-9835.

Wills/ Power of Attorney

Living Will- This is a declaration to their physician. This is a document signed by a patient giving instructions to physicians under certain circumstances. Forms can be obtained at www.Gwarr.org

Power of Attorney for Health Care (POA-HC)-A document that authorizes another person (agent) to make health care decisions for the person executing the document (principal) consistent with the terms of the document and based on the wishes, effective when the principal is unable to make health care decisions. It can include, but need not, a statement of wishes regarding future care. It is essential that principals talk to their agents about their wishes. Information and forms are available at the ADRC or www.gwaar.org under WI Guardianship Support Center or 1-855-409-9410.

Power of Attorney for Finance (POA-F)- A document that you (principal) complete and sign, naming another individual (agent) to manage your finances. Information and forms are available at the ADRC or www.gwaar.org under WI Guardianship Support Center or 1-855-409-9410.

Last Will and Testament- Consumer can choose to complete forms and write on their own or have an attorney assist. Reduced fee attorney programs are through State Bar of Wisconsin (1-800-362-9082) & Legal Action of Wisconsin (1-800-362-3904).

Medicare is health insurance for people over the age of 65, people under the age of 65 with certain disabilities and people at any stage with End-Stage Renal Disease.

Medicaid is a federal/state program, which covers medical care for eligible individuals. Covers co-payments and deductibles not paid by Medicare. Medicaid will pay for long term care in a nursing home, but there are income and asset limitations to qualify. You must be considered Elderly, Blind, or Disabled.

BadgerCare Plus is health insurance for eligible individuals that meet certain income and asset limitations.

Adult Family Homes— A place where 3 or 4 adults who are not related to the operator reside and receive care, treatment or services that are above the level of room and board and that may include up to 7 hours per week of nursing care per resident. Family Care certifies one and two bed adult family homes; the State of Wisconsin licenses three and four bed adult family homes.

Community Based Residential Facilities (CBRF)- Sometimes referred to as **Assisted Living Facility**, A place where 5 or more unrelated people live together in a community setting. Services provided include room and board, supervision, support services, and may include up to 3 hours of nursing care per week.

Residential Care Apartment Complexes (RCAC)- Independent apartment units in which the following services are provided: room and board, up to 28 hours per week of supportive care, personal care, and nursing services.

Nursing Home & Rehabilitation Facility— Facilities that offer skilled nursing care when extensive personal care and medical needs exist. *Check with the nursing home of your choice, to see if they offer a Memory Care Unit, if applicable.
